### Brief Bio Wendy L. Sellers 2022

Wendy L. Sellers, RN, MA, CSE, FASHA, a national author and trainer, has been a passionate advocate for the health of children and youth for more than 35 years. She is a registered nurse with a master's degree in Family and Consumer Sciences.

Wendy is known nationally for writing and publishing *Puberty: The Wonder Years*, a curriculum for 4th, 5<sup>th</sup>, and 6th graders. Ms. Sellers co-authored the nationally recognized *Michigan Model for Health*, the K-12 comprehensive health curriculum that is on the prestigious National Registry of Evidence-based Programs and Practices as an evidence-based drug and violence prevention program. Wendy also contributed a chapter to *Legal Resource for School Health Services* and reviews manuscripts for the *American Journal of Sexuality Education*.

As the founder and president of Health 4 Hire, Inc., Ms. Sellers provides a variety of consulting services, including training, public speaking, and writing for organizations and professionals across the nation. Wendy has taught thousands of educators how to teach sex education and presents sessions on effective sex education at state and national conferences. Wendy advocates for skills-based, comprehensive, sex education that starts early, involves parents, and meets students' needs. Among her favorite activities are answering students' questions about sexuality and equipping others to be "ask-able" adults. With these credentials and her dynamic presentation

style, Wendy is a sought-after presenter on school health and advocacy at state and national conferences.
